TRADE PROTOCOL

BETWEEN

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KENYA

AND

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF RWANDA

The Government of the Republic of Kenya and the Government of the Republic of Rwanda (hereinafter referred to as the *Contracting Parties*).

IN ACCORDANCE with the spirit of the Trade Agreement signed between the two countries on 4 th February 1979, on 22nd July 1981 and

 $\underline{\textit{FOR THE PURPOSE}}$ of furthering trade relations on the basis of equality and mutual benefit ;

HAVE AGREED as follows :-

ARTICLE 1

1.01. The Contracting Parties shall give strong encouragement and extend facilities to their respective foreign trade enterprises to purchase from each other respectively the goods enumerated in list 'A' and 'B' to be exchanged by the parties hereto.

1.02. List 'A' shall indicate commodities available for export by Kenya to Rwanda and list 'B' shall indicate commodities available for export by Rwanda to Kenya. These lists shall only be indicative but not exhaustive.

ARTICLE 2

2.01. The Contracting Parties undertake to encourage trade between their two countries with a view to constantly achieving higher levels of trade for their mutual benefit.

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3.01. This Protocol is supplemental to and shall not imply any limitation or restriction on the normal trade carried on between the two countries under the provisions of the Trade Agreement signed on February 4, 1979 between the two Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE 4

- 4.01. The Contracting Parties undertake, subject to the customs and other laws and regulations in force in the two countries, to facilitate transit trade through their respective countries by all means of transport and not to subject such transit transport to transit duties except for payment to be made in accordance with prevailing agreements for costs incurred in respect of handling and other transit operations.
- 4.02. The Contracting Parties undertake to facilitate the movement of vehicles belonging to either country through their respective countries unde their original registration marks.
- 4.03. The Contracting Parties undertake to facilitate movement of goods and people to cater for the bilateral trade needs of nationals of the two countries.

ARTICLE 5

5.01. The Contracting Parties having due regard to the laws in the two countries shall extend to each other most favoured nation treatment in the operations and administration of customs formalities and procedures in order to expand the flow of trade between their two countries.

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ARTICLE 6

6.01. In order to facilitate the implementation of this Trade Protocol, a Joint Committee for Trade, which shall consist of an equal number of representatives designated by the respective Governments, shall be established to:-

- (a) review the implementation of the provisions of this Protocol
- (b) examine measures for the solution of problems which arise in the scope of development of trade between the two countries
- (c) consider proposals made by either Contracting Party within the framework of this Protocol aimed at further expansion and diversification of trade between the two countries.

6.02. The Joint Committee shall meet as and when necessary either in Nairobi or Kigali at the request either Contracting Party.

ARTICLE 7

7.01. The present Protocol shall come into force on the date of signature by both parties. It shall remain in force for a period of one year and be renewed automatically thereafter for a like period, unless one of the Parties gives to the other a six months! notice in writing of intention to terminate this Protocol, provided that such termination shall not affect the validity of contracts already concluded under this Protocol.

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IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the duly authorised representatives of the two Contracting Parties have signed this Protocol and affixed their seals thereto.
